## 1. PROFILE

Born in Ancona (Italy) in 1991, in September 2015 I obtained, with honors, the Master Degree in *Urban Planning and Policy Design* at the School of Architecture and Society of Politecnico di Milano. In November 2015, I started the Ph.D. in *Urban and Regional Development* at Politecnico di Torino and I obtained the degree in January 2019 with the thesis “Urban/rural co-productions. Planning and governance approaches for improving the relationships between city and countryside in Italy and England”.

During my Master and Ph.D., I developed a keen interest in the interfaces between spatial planning and food systems, with a focus on the consumption-production nexus and on the role of local actors in transforming the foodscapes. In my Ph.D. thesis (supervisors: prof. Giuseppe Cinà, DiST/POLITO, and prof. Matthew Reed, CCRI/University of Gloucestershire), I investigated the broad challenges of food systems in different case-study areas across Italy and England, looking at the relational dynamics of food chains and at the multiple configurations of the urban/rural relationships. The research moves across different disciplines (urban planning, policy analysis, and rural studies) and its outcome is an empirical analysis of planning policies and governance arrangements which led me to define innovative scenarios oriented to sustain the transition toward more sustainable food systems. In 2017, as part of the doctoral research, I was visiting research fellow at the Countryside and Community Research Institute (CCRI) of the University of Gloucestershire (UK) to investigate the planning policies and the governance spaces in the city-region of Bristol, one of the case studies of my thesis.

After the Ph.D., between April 2019 and March 2020, I was postdoc research fellow in Spatial Planning at the Department of Urban and Regional Planning and Studies (DiST) of Politecnico di Torino as part of the research ECOWELFARE (2018-20) coordinated by prof. Carolina Giaimo. I carried on multidimensional mapping and analysis of ecosystem services, with a focus on assessing the impacts generated by settlement change dynamics in the case-study area, the metropolitan area of Turin. The research elaborated guidelines for the integration of ES in planning policies and strategies, and shared with planning officers a set of policy tools for the sustainable management of periurban areas, informing the process of elaboration of the new Territorial Plan of the Metropolitan City of Turin.

Since May 2020 and June 2021, I held a postdoctoral research fellowship in Spatial Planning at the Department of Architecture and Urban Studies (DASTU) of Politecnico di Milano as part of the Horizon EU2020 research [COHSMO](#) (2017-21) (supervisors: proff. Carolina Pacchi and Costanzo Ranci). The research has investigated the nexus between socio-economic structures of inequality, urbanization, and territorial cohesion, and how territorial cohesion affects economic growth, spatial justice, and democratic capacities. I worked closely with researchers from all over Europe to investigate the complex planning and governance dynamics of disadvantaged and lagging behind regions. The outcome of the research, published in a [handbook](#) edited by Maja Neergaard & Rikke Skovgaard Nielsen from Aalborg University, is a set of cross-sectoral policy recommendations for strengthening the effectiveness of territorial cohesion policies, considering the main variations, tensions, and trade-offs that characterize the phenomenon of territorial inequality in Europe.

In July 2022, I concluded my 3<sup>rd</sup> year postdoc fellowship working at the research project “[Coltivare\\_Salute.com](#)” (2020-22) coordinated by prof. Michele Ugolini. The project aimed at producing design guidelines for the implementation of new Community Health Centers (CHC) (Case della Comunità) in urban areas. With my research, I contributed to develop an Atlas of CHCs that served as a tool to describe and compare different models of health centers according to several criteria, concerning the typology of services provided and of the building/block hosting the center, the levels of accessibility from public transport or soft mobility paths, and the spatial and functional relationships with the public services located at walkable distance.

From September 2022 to February 2023, I was postdoc fellowship at the IUAV University of Venice working at a research project on social innovation in inner peripheral areas, supervised by proff. Ezio Micelli and Elena Ostanel. The research investigated under what conditions social innovation can be interpreted as a resource in inner peripheries and, at the same time, if inner peripheries offer a fertile ground for social innovation to emerge and develop.

Since February 2023, I am Assistant Professor (rtda) in Spatial Planning (Icar/20) at the Department of Architecture and Urban Studies (DASTU) of Politecnico di Milano. I'm working in the POLIMI research group of the National Biodiversity Future Center (NBFC) as part of a multi-disciplinary research program investigating biodiversity dynamics in urban and metropolitan contexts. In particular, my research topic deals with the mapping and monitoring of the socio-spatial impacts of interventions oriented to biodiversity at the urban scale.

Between 2019 and 2021, I was also member of two research groups involved in researches on themes of social interest funded by private foundations in cooperation with universities and local institutions. The first one is the research “The Food Atlas of Monsampolo del Tronto” funded by CARISAP Foundation and the

Municipality of Monsampolo del T. and coordinated by prof. Massimo Sargolini (University of Camerino) and aimed at elaborating a new food plan for the municipality of Monsampolo del T. The second one is “A scuola di spazio pubblico”, research funded by Fondazione Compagnia di San Paolo and coordinated by prof. Carolina Giaimo (Politecnico di Torino) having the purpose of investigating the school-city nexus in Turin, and mapping the interface between educational and planning policies at municipal and metropolitan level.

In 2019 I carried out a consulting and research activity at the Municipality of Castelvetrano in Sicily which led to drafting a document of planning strategies and guidelines for the environmental regeneration of Triscina, a settlement characterised by high rates of informal housing.

As far as teaching is considered, from 2016 to 2021, following annual peer selections, I carried out tutorship in Urban Planning and Urban Design at the Politecnico di Milano and Politecnico di Torino. From September 2020 to June 2021, I was Lecturer in Urbanism theory and practice at the Landscape Architecture and Urban Design Department (LAUD) of Bilkent University (Ankara). From September 2021 to February 2023, I was Adjunct Professor at the School of Architecture Urban Planning Construction Engineering (AUIC) of Politecnico di Milano, teaching in the Planning Studio of the Bachelor Degree in Architectural Design held at the Piacenza campus.

In 2017 I founded with Serena Marchionni the [Laboratorio del Cammino](#) (LdC), an inter-university network which develops research and teaching projects aimed at exploring the contribution of walking in innovating planning education. Alongside the LdC, I coordinated five editions of the walking Summer School, in Central Italy (ViaSalaria, 2017), Sicily (Sicilia coast to coast, 2018), Sardinia (Sardinia Reloaded, 2019), Piemonte (RecycLand, 2021) and Basilicata (SoAVe, 2022) that have seen a total of about 220 students participating to the activities. The network currently involves eleven universities (Politecnico di Torino, Politecnico di Milano, University of Palermo, University of Camerino, University of Cagliari, University of Basilicata, University of Bologna, University of Parma, University of Firenze, University of Trieste, LAUD/Bilkent University). The sixth edition will take place in Friuli-Venezia Giulia and Slovenia from August 21 to September 2, 2023 around the topic of climate risk.

In June 2022, I obtained the National Scientific Qualification (Abilitazione Scientifica Nazionale) for the competition sector 08/F1 “Pianificazione e Progettazione Urbanistica e Territoriale” (II fascia).

The themes of my research and professional activity are mainly three:

- 1) the exploration and analysis of the interfaces between spatial planning and food systems, with a specific emphasis on the role of productive open spaces in strengthening the spatial and functional relationships between city and countryside;
- 2) the experimentation and application of experiential and bodily approaches based on walking in planning education and research;
- 3) the investigation of inner peripheries and exploration of the planning project's forms and approaches in territories characterized by demographic decline, ageing, economic stagnation and welfare retrenchment.
